

What is the Neighborhood Commercial Management Program (NCMP)?

NCMP provides financial assistance, in the form of business loans, to existing businesses looking to expand their operations. One of the primary goals is to create or retain job opportunities for low- and moderate income persons.

What are the benefits of the Neighborhood Commercial Management Program?

- Improve the image of the commercial district in the eyes of neighborhood residents and the community at large.
- Stimulate private investment within the commercial district through property improvement, business development, and expansion
- Improve the quantity and quality of goods and services available to the surrounding community
- Leverage other private resources and public programs.
- Create and/or retain jobs, primarily for low and moderate-income persons.

What can I use NCMP assistance for?

- Acquisition of land and improvements
- Construction of a new building
- Acquisition of real estate if 50% or more is owner occupied. Twenty percent of the net sales proceeds will be returned to the program if the property is sold within five years of the loan.
- Leasehold improvements
- Moving expenses necessary for the completion of the project
- Acquisition of machinery and equipment necessary for the operation of the business
- Repayment of interim financing from an approved construction lender



Who is eligible for NCMP assistance?

- Any borrowing entity that has been in operation for at least two years
- Borrowing entities may include: Owners, Developers, Franchises, Not-for-Profit Organizations, Limited Partnerships
- Borrowing entities may be eligible for GAP Financing for up to 40% of eligible project costs, not to exceed \$250,000 (minimum \$10,000).

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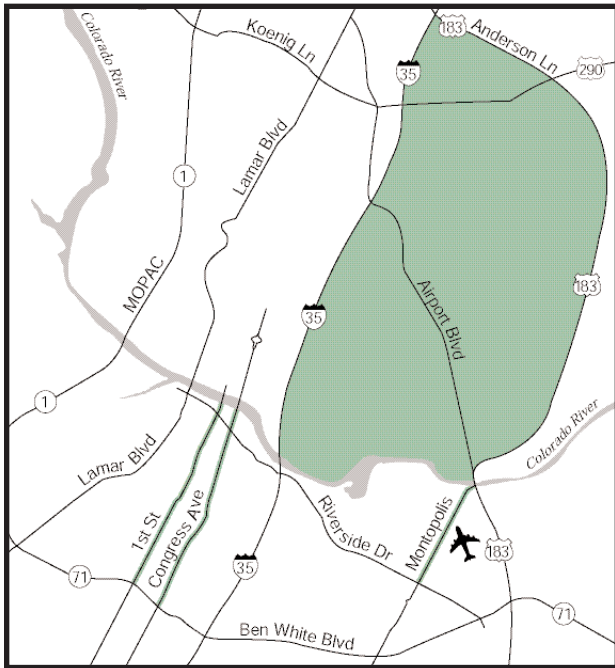
